Results of Deer Fence Survey

he Airports Department has been working on the deer issue at Pine Mountain Lake Airport since late 2003. We have implemented several different methods to try to keep deer from loitering around the airport and from crossing the runway. One of those methods is the installation of the electric fence between the runway and the two parallel taxiways. Over the past two years since the fence has been in place I had received limited feedback on the fence. Recently, questions were raised over the effectiveness of the fence and the risks the fence and the closed taxiway may present.

In an effort to obtain more feedback from pilots, residents and those who frequent the airport, the Airports Department sent out 118 questionnaires. Eighty-two questionnaires were returned for an amazing response rate of 69.5% indicating that most of those polled have a sincere interest in the issue. 93% of the responders are pilots. The following are the results:

Do you think the deer fence is effective at reducing the number of deer on the runway?

Effective or Somewhat Effective - 73% Not Effective – 13 % No Opinion – 15%

Do you think that blocking off the runway exit located 1,000 feet from the west end of the runway presents a safety hazard to pilots?

Yes - 37% No - 56% No Opinion - 7%

Do you think the currently constructed fence presents a safety hazard to aircraft?

Yes - 22% No - 74% No Opinion - 4%

Do you think the deer fence is an eyesore?

Yes - 29% No - 61%No Opinion - 10%

Would you support thinning the deer herd through legally approved depredation methods?

Yes - 83% No - 7% No Opinion - 10%

From these results, we conclude that pilots feel the fence is effective in reducing the number of deer on the runway. However, they also feel the fence and especially the closed runway exit (now reopened) may present a potential hazard to aircraft. Also, the questionnaire clearly shows that pilots believe the real problem is too many deer, and that thinning the herd through legal and humane methods should be considered.
