FROM THE AIRPORTS DIRECTOR – by Jim Thomas

COMMUNITY SPONSORED PROJECTS

S everal individuals have expressed interest in volunteering for projects at the airport. Recently two projects were completed with the help of volunteers: the installation of a new roof on the pilots' lounge and the filling of the cracks in the runway. I've been asked what other projects can be performed by volunteers so I thought it would be a good idea to list four other projects that would improve the safety and appearance of the Pine Mountain Lake Airport.

1) It is generally felt that constructing a deer barrier (fence) along the south east boundary of the airport would reduce the number of deer migrating across the eastern portion of the airport. The fence would begin near the Corsair Restaurant and extend east along the airport boundary behind the hangars, then up and over the hill. The cost and the amount of labor required to install the fence will depend on the fence design, which has not been finalized.

2) As mentioned previously, thanks to a volunteer effort the pilot's lounge has a new roof. Now that the roof has been replaced, the building could use a paint job. The building is small enough that a few volunteers could paint it in a day or two.

3) The airport drainage system requires repair and installation of additional culverts.

Volunteers could repair portions of the drainage

system by fixing some existing culverts and installing a couple of new culverts to mitigate erosion. This work might require the use of a backhoe to assist with backfilling around the new culverts.

4) Two years ago the airport received a PMLAA donation to help with noxious weed control. The money was used to spray pesticide on the weeds. Last year the Airports Department continued this weed spraying effort because to be effective, the spraying must be a multi-year process since these weeds are pretty persistent and hard to eradicate. The continuing noxious weed control effort can be combined with chemical mowing (spraying a weak concentration of pesticide to stunt the growth of the grass) to reduce the deer browse. This will enhance the appearance of our airport and reduce the number of deer adjacent to the runway.

Although spraying of pesticides on County property requires a pesticide applicator's license, donations could be used to hire a commercial company to perform noxious weed control and chemical mowing.

So, here are four volunteer efforts that can be undertaken by the Association or local residents that will enhance our airport. I'd be happy to work with any individual or group which would like to pursue these or any other volunteer project.

PML Aero Club - The long awaited Pine Mountain Lake Airport based flying club, using a Cessna 172, is very close to reality. We are letting everyone know in case there are additional interested pilots wanting to be a part of this group as a "Charter Member". Here are the basics:

1. A group of about 10 locals have met several times and have reached consensus on several items including a set of By-Laws and Operating Policies and Procedures Documents.

2. An agreed upon set of parameters to use in the purchase of the aircraft.

3. An agreement that student pilots are welcomed.

4. A need for a financial commitment from each prospective member of \$4,000.00 plus the annual dues (Maybe the financial commitment should be #1).

5. Several members deposited their checks and a bank account has been opened in the name of "PML Aero Club".

6. An agreement to meet the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of the month 9:30 am at the Jobe's hangar house - until we are fully functional, thereafter every other month. Interested persons please stop by or contact Dennis Smith at 962-4950 or e-mail at jetlag729@sbcglobal.net
